

Guest Speaker; Alana Kilmartin, Unserious Careers - SGHS

'Unserious Careers' author Alana Kilmartin led an engaging interactive talk with all Year 11 students in the school library on Monday 6 May. Alana shared her career pathway and experiences in her personal, school and sporting life (including unsuccessful work experience stories) with the students and encouraged them to "take risks" and "say 'yes' to opportunities" to be successful in life. Alana discussed the differences between school and work life with students and encouraged them to pursue careers that are led by their personal likes and dislikes in a job environment. 
### **Ag News**





### **Transport Concession Entitlement**
