From the Principal's Desk

Year 6 into 7 Orientation Days

Due to the COVID restrictions that are still in place, we had to split our Year 6 into 7 orientation over two days. It was lovely to have the opportunity to speak to the Year 6 students and their parents. I caught up with some of the Year 6 students during the day and they told me they were having a good time participating in the activities, finding their way around the school, catching up with old friends and making new ones. The days were also full of some very important information for parents and I would like to highlight a few of these points:



Year 10 Careers Education

Our fortnightly Year 10 Careers Education lessons are starting to come to an end for the year. The Year 10 students have been working hard on their career development and investigating possible future career pathways. This has included using our SGHS website to develop and complete a resume, cover letter, USI and Work Safety Certificates. We have spent a lot of time on HSC subject selections and goal setting for the next couple of years. Many of the students have engaged in work experience, the TAFE YES Program and have enrolled for the Southern Cross University Head Start Program. We have had career presentations from the Australian Defence Force and Individual Placement Support Services, and many of our Year 10 students have gained casual employment and a School Based Traineeship/Apprenticeship.

Construction Course

Novaskill – Construction Pre-Apprenticeship Course (EPPP – Pilot 8)

A total of 14 students from the four Grafton Cluster EPPP schools, including five students from South Grafton High School, have been attending a Smart and Skilled Construction Pre-Apprenticeship training course at Grafton over the past few weeks. The course has been conducted at South Grafton



High School, using the Trade Skills Centre facilities.

Students have been developing skills and knowledge to demonstrate competencies in the national recognised units of 'Apply OHS requirements and procedures in the construction industry', 'Carry out measurements and calculations', 'Read and interpret plans and specifications' & 'Conduct workshop communications'. These units contribute to the Certificate II in Construction Pathways qualification.

The course includes 9 days of training and assessment plus 1 day of Careers development including mock interviews, industry aptitude testing, and developing a resume. All students have been aligned with an industry employer from the trade of their interest to undertake 5 days of industry learning and work experience next week.



Other areas of skill development during the course include team work, time management, leadership, planning, use of technology in the industry, and networking with students from other schools and employers. Guest speakers from the construction industry were also on hand to discuss training, apprenticeships and what to expect as a new young employee/ worker.

SGHS student Julia Forge has been enjoying the course over the past few weeks.

"It's been so much fun, I've learnt about levelling and what kinds of brick to use," Julia said.

Julia said she wanted to do the course for the experience, and she has already applied for two apprenticeships. "It will definitely help me with future jobs, it already has," Julia said.

The Construction Course has been offered to school students for free as part of the NSW Department of Education Educational Pathways Pilot Program (EPPP) operating at SGHS. On completion of the training, students will undertake an evaluation survey to further improve the training in future years.


