From the Principal's Desk

We are excited to see how this can help staff and students with their relationships and engagement here at South Grafton High School.

I would like to thank our students and parents for their support with our emphasis on student attendance. We are already seeing improvements and it has been pleasing to recognise those students each week with perfect attendance. Explaining student absences is important and helps us to support students when they are away for sickness or other issues. The easiest way to respond is to reply to the text message sent home each day they are away. We will have further information and guides to support parents around this in the coming weeks.

I would like to acknowledge Esther Barker on her selection in the NSW CHS Rugby Team which will tour New Zealand in April this year. She will go to Auckland, Wellington, Taupo and Christchurch with games against some of the top Rugby schools in New Zealand. Esther will attend a training camp at the Canterbury Crusaders Academy, which is one of the most successful rugby franchises in the world. The team will also have the chance to have breakfast with an All Black and Black Fern player as well as cultural experiences in New Zealand. We wish Esther the best of luck on her tour and can't wait for her to return and tell us all about it.

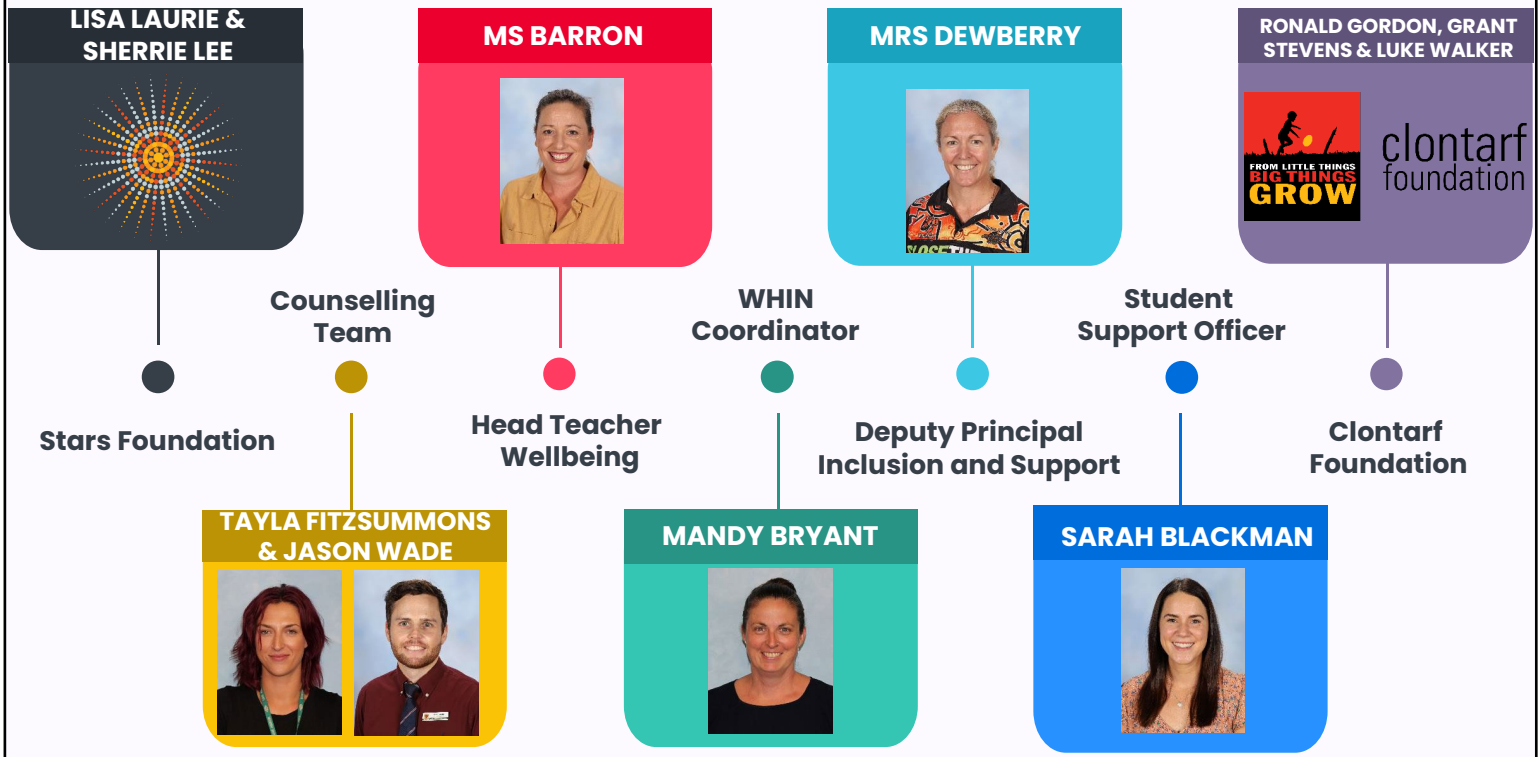

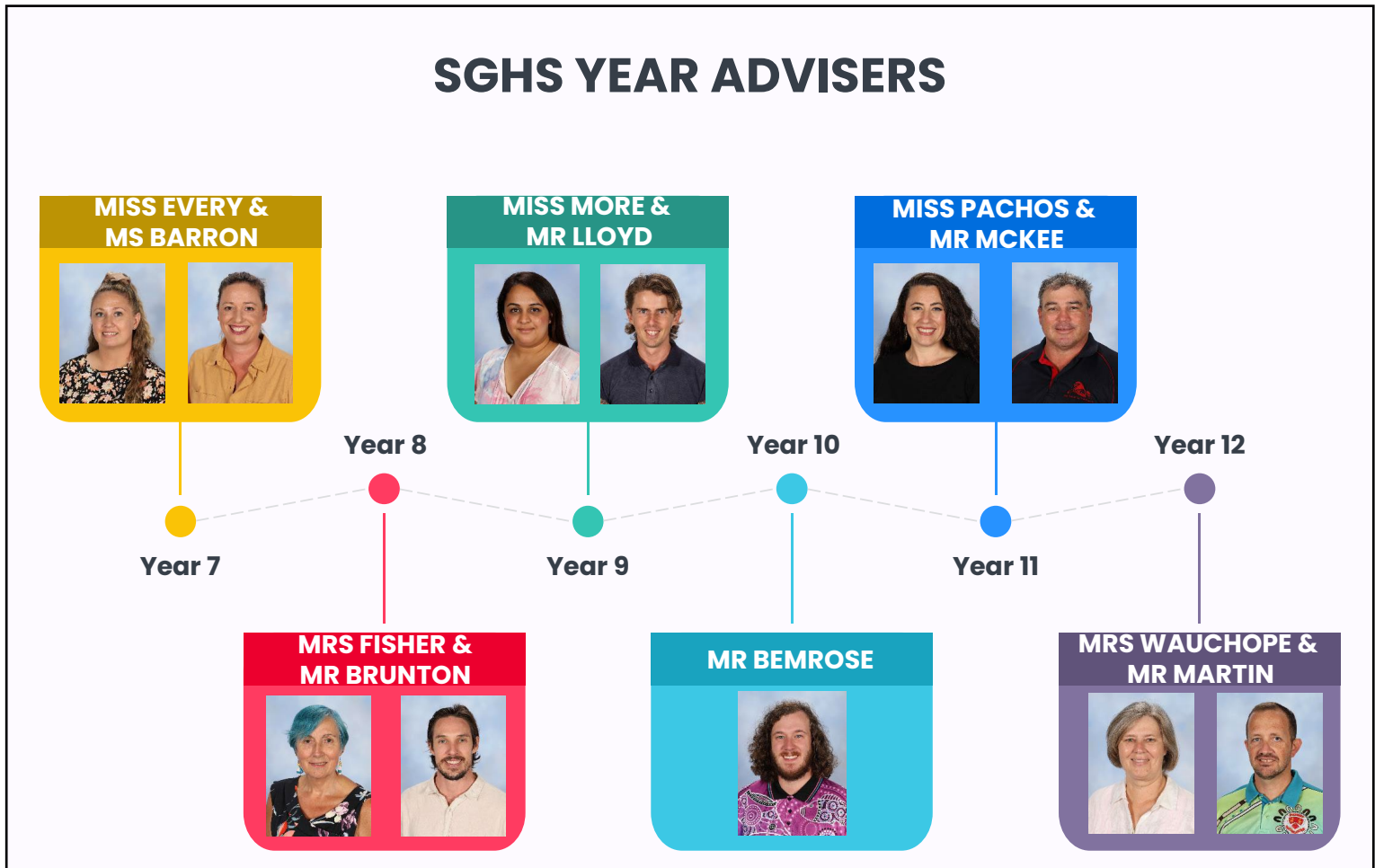

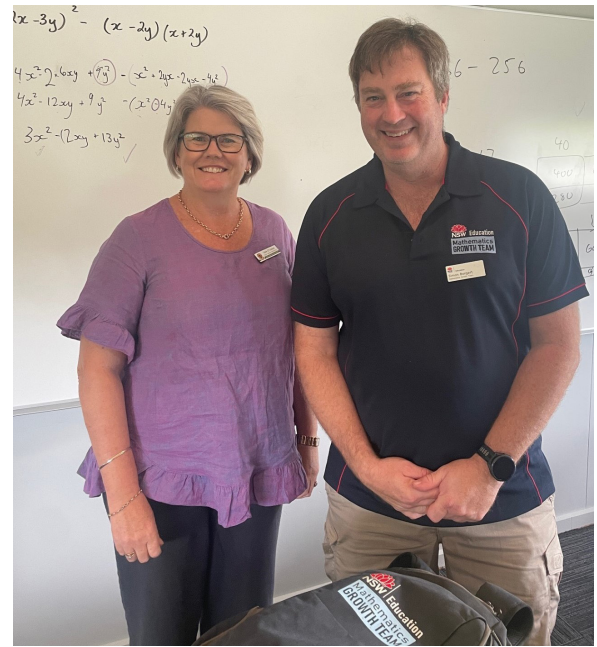

NAPLAN Online Testing 2024 – Year 7 and Year 9

Year 7 and Year 9 students at our school will be sitting the NAPLAN tests on 13th, 14th and 15th March this year.

These tests are mandatory and will be held in our school hall.

The school asks that students come prepared to do their best. There will be staff in the hall to assist students where possible.

Students will need to bring the following:

- A pair of headphones or earphones (airpods and bluetooth earphones will not be compatible)
- A pen or pencil
- A calculator for the numeracy test on Friday

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an assessment of literacy and numeracy skills. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy.

Excessive preparation for NAPLAN Online is not recommended. Students can use the public demonstration site (<https://www.nap.edu.au/online-assessment/public-demonstration-site>) to familiarise themselves with the types of questions and tools available in the NAPLAN Online tests.

Year 12 Students with Special Needs or disabilities

The process is underway for students with special needs or disabilities to apply for special requirements during the 2024 HSC exams eg. Reader/Writer, Rest Breaks, Small Group Supervision, Food/Drink required for medical reasons, etc. Any Year 12 students who wish to apply for Disability Provisions for the HSC, please contact Ms Kinny or Mr Martin (Learning and Support Teachers) in the Library. In order to qualify for various provisions, specific evidence is required such as assessments and/or medical evidence as well as teacher comments. The School must submit all the required evidence to NESA by the end of Term 1 2024. After that time, other applications may be submitted as issues arise.
