From the Principal's Desk

This week has seen our Year 7 and Year 9 students complete their NAPLAN testing for 2024. I would like to congratulate the students on their positive approach to this as I witnessed students working hard and trying their best over the course of the three days. The results from this testing will assist us in identifying the strengths and weaknesses across these year groups. Results will be made available during Term 2.

I know that I have mentioned attendance numerous times this year, but I would like to highlight the improvements that we have seen so far this term. When compared to 2023 we have seen close to a 7% increase in overall attendance and nearly double the number of students attending over 90% of the time. I would like to congratulate our students and thank our school community for valuing education and the positives that come from consistent attendance. It has been great to acknowledge students in each year group every week with 100% attendance.

Tuesday saw us invite the primary school teachers from each of our feeder schools to catch up with their Year 6 students from 2023 and see how Year 7 had started. To say the students were excited about seeing their old teachers again would be an understatement. What came through was the positive conversations around being at high school and the new opportunities they had experienced.

On Tuesday 26 March 2024, we will be holding our Year 7 2025 parent information evening. The session will commence at 5.00pm with information about the school, meeting our Year Advisors, a tour of our facilities and light refreshments. This will be the first of several opportunities for parents and students to speak with our staff as we work towards ensuring that the transition from primary to high school is a smooth and successful one. I look forward to seeing everyone on the night.





2024 HSC Year 12 Students with Special Needs or disabilities

The process is underway for students with special needs or disabilities to apply for special requirements during the 2024 HSC exams eg. Reader/Writer, Rest Breaks, Small Group Supervision, Food/Drink required for medical reasons, etc. Any Year 12 students who wish to apply for Disability Provisions for the HSC, please contact Ms Kinny or Mr Martin (Learning and Support Teachers) in the Library. In order to qualify for various provisions, specific evidence is required such as assessments and/or medical evidence as well as teacher comments. The school must submit all the required evidence to NESA by the end of Term 1 2024. After that time, other applications may be submitted as issues arise.






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
